Interns will help research and promote economic, cultural, and political relations with key actors in the Arab Gulf region, against the backdrop of regional and global tensions stemming from the 2023 Israel-Hamas War.

General requirements

- Registered undergraduate students (3rd or 4th year) and graduate students from all Reichman University schools.
- Excellent research skills.
- Deep knowledge and understanding of current affairs, global trends, and international diplomacy.
- High-level English fluency.
- Commitment to 6-8 hours weekly; available for work during both fall and spring semesters.
- Mandatory and active participation in all program meetings and workshops during the year.

Accreditation:

If they have not previously completed an accredited internship, students can choose to intern for 2 academic credits, subject to approval by their academic track coordinators. Alternatively, they may opt to participate in the program as a non-credit internship.

How to apply:

Candidates must upload their CV, a short cover letter, and an academic writing sample – all in English – to the link below. Submission guidelines can be found on the <u>internships page</u> on our website. The application deadline is **Wednesday**, **January 3rd**, **2024**, **at 1pm Israel Time**.

Suitable candidates will be invited to an interview with our staff shortly after the submission deadline, and may also be asked to complete a task relevant to their desired position. Admission to the program will be decided based on availability and the candidate's skills and merit.

The internship program will begin January 25th, 2024.
