Requirements and Submission Guidelines

General requirements:

- > Registered students from all IDC schools.
- > Fluent English (command of additional languages an advantage).
- > Open to 2nd and 3rd year BA students and MA students.
- > Students must commit to 6-8 weekly work hours (approx. 120-140 hours overall).
- > Mandatory participation in 4 group meetings and workshops during the year.

Specific requirements for “The Arena”:

- > Excellent academic writing skills.
- > Media and journalistic affinity.
- > Interested in journalistic and/or literary editing and copywriting.
- > Deep knowledge and understanding of international diplomacy and current affairs.

Accreditation:

Students can choose to take the internship for 2 academic credits (subject to approval by their academic track coordinators, and only if they have not previously completed an accredited internship), or as a non-credit internship.

Candidates must fill in their personal details and submit their CV, an academic writing sample in English, and a short cover letter **no later than Monday, November 2nd, 2020, at 23:59.**
